


Click "Download" button





Double click a file "filezilla-3-20-0.bz2"


FileZilla.app is created





Create a shortcut in the Dock and double Click the Filezilla icon in the Dock




Don't click "install new version" and click "Close"


Click "File"


Click “Site Manager”





Click “New Site”




Give a name (ex, phonlab)




Enter your “password” and click “OK”
